

## **San Jose's Jennifer Martin takes both Scratch & Handicap titles in BBA's Women's event at Earl Anthony's Dublin Bowl**

It wasn't an official proclamation from the mayor, but it was definitely Jennifer Martin Day on April 17<sup>th</sup> in the City of Dublin. In the Bowl Bay Area Women's Division 5-Game singles, Martin won both the scratch & handicap titles. And in the process, she won a spot in the 2011 U.S. Women's Open to be contested in the Dallas area from June 24-30.

In the scratch division, Martin went from 4<sup>th</sup> to the lead after shooting the tournament's high game (268) in game #4. A 238 in game 5 gave her a final total of 1159 and a margin of victory of 68 pins and the \$450 top prize.

Going into game 5, just 4 pins separated 2<sup>nd</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup> places. After game 5, just 8 pins separated 2<sup>nd</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup> places. However, it wasn't the same 3 bowlers!

Brandy Mastro was in 5<sup>th</sup> place and 32 pins out of 4<sup>th</sup> when game 5 began. A big 257 game, jumped her up 3 spots to finish in 2<sup>nd</sup> place with 1091 for \$300.

Jeanette Adams was steady all day long. She was the only bowler to have 5 games of 200 or better. She was never higher than 3<sup>rd</sup> or lower than 6<sup>th</sup> all tournament. She finished with 1089 and won \$200 for taking 3<sup>rd</sup> place.

In her 1<sup>st</sup> BBA Women's event, Laura Brochu held the lead after games 2 & 3 after shooting a 266 in game 2. She ended up finishing in 4<sup>th</sup> place with 1083 for \$150. Laura also finished in 6<sup>th</sup> place in the handicap division. Erin Lenahan rounded out the cashers finishing in 5<sup>th</sup> place for \$100 with 1031.

Jennifer took a different path to the handicap title. The only time she led was at the tournament end. She was in 18<sup>th</sup> place after game 1. A 263 game with handicap jumped her 13 spots to 5<sup>th</sup> place. A 240 with handicap in game 3 moved her up 1 spot. The before mentioned 268 scratch game (287 handicap) moved her into second place, just 2 pins from the top spot. Her sidepot winning 257 in the final game gave her a final score of 1254 & \$220.

Renee Rockwell finished in 2<sup>nd</sup> place just 15 pins behind Martin. Renee was the leader after game 4 as a 258 scratch game had taken her from 6<sup>th</sup> to the top. Rockwell earned \$160 for her runner-up finish.

Martha Weber was near the top spot all day. She led the tournament after games 1 & 3 and was in 3<sup>rd</sup> place for the rest of the day. She earned \$120 for 3<sup>rd</sup> place.

Christine Shene overcame a tough start, 28<sup>th</sup> place after 1 game to finish in 4<sup>th</sup> place for \$100 and Cheri Svenson's final game of 251 with handicap jumped her from 10<sup>th</sup> to round out the top 5 for \$80.
